



Ellen Weber is the Vice President for Health Initiatives at the Legal Action Center. For over thirty years, Ms. Weber has worked to expand access to health services for persons with substance use disorders and challenge discrimination in employment housing and insurance through litigation, and state and federal legislative and policy advocacy. Ms. Weber worked at the Legal Action Center from 1985-2002 and established the Center's D.C. office and, among other initiatives, led the field's efforts to obtain protections for persons with substance use disorders under the Americans with Disabilities Act. Ms. Weber served on the Faculty of the University Of Maryland Carey School Of Law from 2002 to July 2017, where she established and directed the Drug Policy and Public health Strategies Clinic. She worked with students on disability rights litigation and legislative advocacy, health care reform and Parity Act implementation in Maryland and harm reduction initiatives. Ms. Weber has published in the area of disability rights, women's health issues, and integration of substance use disorder treatment in primary care and the enforcement of the Parity Act. Ms. Weber started her legal career as a trial attorney in the U.S. Justice Department, Civil Rights Division. She graduated from Dickinson College and New York University School of Law.
